Week 1 and 2, 2020 (Phase 0 of staged return)

School remains open for all students of essential workers every day, as well as for families who have a special need or reason to attend school every day.

All other students will be engaged in remote learning until the end of Week 2.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is a staged return to face-to-face learning?

A staged return involves students being gradually reintroduced to face-to-face learning on campus starting from one day a week in Week 3 (phase 1), through to a full-time school (phase 4). For more details, download the department's quide for families of each phase of the staged return.

Why are we doing a staged return to school?

A staged return means there are a smaller number of students at school each day, providing more space to spread out. It helps to balance the varied needs of students and staff, their families, personal circumstances and workplaces. The flexibility also means we can quickly respond if there are any spikes in the spread of COVID-19.

How long will Phase 1 last?

Phase 1 will continue until we are advised by the NSW Department of Education to introduce a different phase for our campus. The phased approach has been designed to be flexible and responsive to the circumstances as they change.

What will phase 1 of the return look like at our campus?

From Tuesday 12 May, every student at Waratah Campus is expected to attend school one day per week, with up to 25% of students in attendance on any given day. This will be a rostered system based on students' House groups, with each student attending only on their designated day^{*}.

No new work will be posted on Mondays for the duration of phase 1. Instead, Mondays will begin with an online assembly, followed by a pupil free day on campus to give staff a chance to check submitted work, monitor who is engaging online and determine who requires further support. Students will be expected to work from home on Mondays to consolidate their learning from the week before, complete and submit any unfinished tasks and check in with their learning page resources.

What can I expect when my child is at school?

- Students follow their normal timetabled classes and will see their classroom teachers for support and questions.
- Students will access the same work in the classroom as the students who are learning from home that day. They will just have more opportunity to clarify their work and ask for help from their teachers in person.
- Students will be in classes of 10 students or less. In large learning spaces (e.g. the library) there will be no more than 15 students at any one time.
- Each year group will be allocated a separate playground area for recess and lunch breaks and restricted movement of students around the school.
- Continued enhanced cleaning and hygiene supply arrangements, including cleaning of toilets and other high touch areas throughout the day, as well as supply of hand sanitiser in every classroom.
- Expectations of student behaviour (including hygiene expectations) will be addressed regularly and students unable to meet these expectations will move through our usual discipline process.

Do I have to send my child on their allocated day?

We need your support by sending your child on their designated day only, unless you are an essential worker. This way we will be able to manage the return of students safely and in a staggered way that supports the Department of Education's guidelines.

If you are particularly worried about your child attending school for one day per week, please contact Ms Macdonald to discuss your concerns.

What is being done to ensure the school is safe?

We continue to implement appropriate social distancing measures proportionate to health advice:

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- Reduced numbers of students on campus each day
- No interschool competitions
- No excursions
- No 'in person' assemblies
- Limits to the numbers of students in learning spaces at any one time
- Enhanced cleaning and hygiene arrangements

No parent access on school grounds

We encourage you to remain in your car when dropping off and picking up your child/children and to continue to contact the school via phone or email. We also ask for your continued support in keeping your child home if they are showing signs of being unwell.

*Please note: The school will remain open for all essential workers' children to access every day during the staged return, as well as for families who have a special need to attend school every day.
