#### HIGH EXPECTATIONS Achieving our best and improving our learning

To achieve our best, look our best and to improve our learning, a series of high expectations have been put in place at Callaghan College Waratah.

PHONES: Many parents attended our information evenings last term and the topic of mobile phones was raised frequently. In response to this, we have developed a new mobile phone policy for the whole school. Messaging supporting the policy will be displayed in all our classrooms. Students will be expected to have phones off and away in their bags for the whole lesson. If a student does not follow this request, their phone will be removed and placed in a locked box in the teacher's desk. The phone will be returned at the end of the lesson, but contact will be made home by either a Head Teacher or a Deputy Principal. In our assembly this week, our School Captains outlined the importance of staying focused and limiting distractions in classrooms.

UNIFORM: Now that all items of uniform have arrived, our expectation is for all Year 7 students to be wearing the new uniform and when the old uniform stock runs out, Year 8-10 will be expected to purchase the new uniform. Purchasing online is very simple and items can either be delivered to your home, or picked up from the school. The School Locker Shop at the University of Newcastle is also a good option if you need to try sizes. Our own Uniform Shop is open on a Wednesday afternoon for students to try on uniforms. Students must be accompanied by a parent to be out of class to do this.

With the very cold weather we are seeing many different coloured jumpers in the school. The new school jumper and jacket have been designed to provide maximum warmth for students and both are reasonably priced. If you are experiencing difficulty with the cost of uniform, please make contact with our front office and they can assist with the process of applying for assistance. The wearing of uniform is important for our school and we appreciate our families support in this area. We understand that cost is sometimes an issue for families and will provide help where this is the case. A high quality uniform gives students pride and can be worn for many years.

ATTENDANCE: The Department of Education has identified that 95% attendance and above is the rate that provides students with the best chance to achieve in both school life and beyond. We understand that sometimes absence due to illness is unavoidable, but the most important thing is to let us know the reason for your student's absence. You can respond to the SMS sent by the school, ring the school, email the school address or send a note back in to the front office. This means that your child has their absence justified and their attendance rate stays high.

#### **Minimising transmissions**

#### MASKS

Masks are strongly encouraged for all staff and students for the first 4 weeks of Term 3. This temporary measure will minimise the risk of transmission events at our schools and protect the health and safety of our students, staff and school community.

#### COVID ISOLATION REGULATIONS

• If your child is a close contact you are requested to report this to the school. Your child can still attend school but should conduct a daily RAT and return a negative result each morning before coming to school. They must also wear a mask indoors (except when eating or exercising). They will not be permitted to participate in overnight excursions, including camps. • If your child receives a positive RAT test, families need to:

 record the positive RAT result through the Service NSW website or Service NSW app – and add details of your child's school.

- notify the school of the positive RAT or PCR test result as soon as possible

- follow NSW Health advice to isolate for 7 days.

• Students and staff should not be at school if they are sick or display symptoms. The same processes remain in place regarding sending students to sick bay if they are displaying covid like symptoms.

• Please refer to the NSW Government's COVID-19 pages if you have questions or concerns about testing and isolation requirements If you are unsure whether to send your child to school or not please contact our Administration Office for advice.
