Star Struck is back for 2023 and this year it's set to be bigger and better than ever.





Pathway to university

In April, the NSW Government announced their decision to implement a ban on secondary students' use of mobile phones in public schools as part of their commitment to improve students' learning and social development. This ban will come into effect in Term 4 and follows bans that are already in place for NSW primary schools, as well as secondary schools in South Australia, the Northern Territory, Victoria and Western Australia.

Our staff will be discussing procedures to support the new rules with students over the coming months and sharing insights into the reasons for the ban. Our campus has already been proactive in this space with our 'Off and Away' policy in classrooms. This term, we will extend that further by commencing plans to introduce the Yondr Program to support the implementation of the government's new rules. This approach enables our students to retain possession and responsibility over their phones at school whilst still providing the benefits of phone-free classroom and playground spaces.

If contact needs to be made between families and students during school hours, communication can be made via our Administration Office.

We encourage families to have open discussions about the future changes and to contact the school with any questions you may have. We look forward to working with you to ensure our school is a positive and safe place for our students and a place in which learning is at the forefront.

#### **YONDR**

To help with the ban of mobile phones within schools, Callaghan Waratah have decided to implement the Yondr Program for our campus.

This program uses a simple, lockable pouch, that stores a student's mobile phone during the school day. Every student will secure their phone in their personally assigned pouch when they arrive to school. They will then be in possession of their phone throughout the day, before the pouch is unlocked when exiting the school. Students will be responsible for their own Yondr pouches and must bring them to school each day.

Over 150 Australian schools already use the Yondr Program, joining over 2,000 schools globally. Using these pouches and having phones away encourages students to be more mindful and less distracted, be more engaged in classroom activities, along with improving their communication and interpersonal skills. It also prevents antisocial behaviour.

Further information on the program and the processes around it will be distributed in the coming months.
